### MISSION DRIVEN

With over 1,400 members, the Washington DC Post (Chapter) is the largest Post in the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME). Membership and attendance at Washington DC Post monthly programs continues to grow! **124 new members joined the Washington DC Post this past month, and 237 new members joined in the last two months!** That is a sure indicator that we are successfully delivering quality programs and excellent networking opportunities to our members.

The Society of American Military Engineers is a unique professional engineering Society, whose mission is to promote and facilitate engineering support for national security by developing and enhancing relationships and competencies among uniformed services, public and private sector engineers, and related professionals. With over 125 Society Posts at home and abroad, run by thousands of dedicated volunteers, SAME is a thriving oasis of over 20,000 members who are A/E/C and related industry professionals and who possess leadership skills that aim to lead the professional and personal growth of all SAME members in support of military readiness and development of solutions to national security, the Society vision. The SAME mission and vision are integral to Washington DC Post daily operations.

### RECORD ATTENDANCE

Over 160 people attended the Washington DC Post September Program on NAVFAC's Transformation! That's twice the average monthly program attendance, which usually still draws over 70 people at each monthly program! The NAVFAC presentation saw the largest attendance in recent program history at a lunch program.

Rear Admiral Mike Loose, Commander of NAVFAC and Chief of Civil Engineers, gave an excellent presentation that our members and guests valued. RADM Loose explained how NAVFAC's historic transformation is happening worldwide and in "real time" - a truly impressive feat for an \$7B worldwide operation.

Rear Admiral Loose's message that NAVFAC and its business partners are One Team was illustrated by highlighting that over \$6B of NAVFAC's services are provided by contract. This resonated with members in attendance and was a perfect example of the importance of the SAME mission to develop and enhance relationships and competencies among uniformed services, public and private sector engineers, and related professionals.

NAVFAC Washington's Commanding Officer, CAPT Chris Mossey then provided an example of NAVFAC's transformation by describing the merger of the Public Works Center Washington and Engineering Field Activity Chesapeake into one new NAVFAC Washington command this past summer. CAPT Chris Mossey also provided a brief on the numerous contracting opportunities for our business partners to support NAVFAC Washington this coming year.

### MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

Out of the 160 people who attended the NAVFAC transformation program, over 60 were non members! That's impressive and shows that the Washington DC Post is a magnet for professional development and networking opportunities.

# Young Members Spotlight

## Kennedy Center Tour and Show Highlights

The SAME Washington DC Post Young Members Committee organized a phenomenal outing to The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. This full day of events was a spectacular venture into a world of the arts, as well as into the halls of one of the most renowned and historic arts centers in the world.

The Grand Foyer serves as a lobby for the Concert Hall, Opera House, and Eisenhower Theater, and is located on the River side of the Kennedy Center. It is 60 feet high and 630 feet long, making it one of the largest rooms in the world.*

"The Kennedy Center, located on the banks of the Potomac River near the Lincoln Memorial, opened to the public in September 1971. But its roots date back to 1958, when President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed bipartisan legislation creating a National Cultural Center. In honor of Eisenhower's vision for such a facility, one of the Kennedy Center's theaters was named for him."

Our Young Members program started out with the Kennedy Center Building Tour. This enchanting one-hour tour gave everyone the opportunity to go behind the scenes and experience first hand the dynamics of an arts center.

Some highlights from the tour included the Concert Hall, the Opera House (which our Young Members attended during the performance), the Eisenhower Theater, the Israeli Lounge, the African Lounge, and the Chinese Lounge, the Bird Room, the Hall of Nations and the Hall of States. Most interesting of all was the George Rogers Clark Room, called the Bird Room, so named because of the contribution by the George Rogers Clark Society of Virginia that funded the construction of the room. Clark, as many of you know, was a frontiersman, American Revolutionary War general, and the brother of William Clark, who was part of the Lewis and Clark expedition exploring the American west in the early 1800s. The Bird Room houses porcelains from the studio of Edward Marshall Boehm. Mr. Boehm

was a lover of nature who in 1950 started the Boehm Porcelain Studio, where he captured birds, small animals and flowers in their natural habitat. Boehm porcelains are highly prized, and have been owned by collectors around the world, including several American Presidents. What a treat!

Tour attendees were thrilled to receive a 10% discount coupon on merchandise in the center's gift shop after the tour.

The Kennedy Center Building Tour and a visit to the gift shop was just the beginning of an extraordinary evening. After the tour, our Young Members had the opportunity to network at the Roof Top Terrace Lounge. Good conversation and a light meal gave everyone a much needed boost of energy to continue the evening program.

Next on the agenda was the Bertell Knox Group, a jazz combo of piano, string bass, and saxophone, led by seasoned drummer Bertell Knox, who performed classic jazz in honor of the 100th Birthday of Count Basie. It was hard to stay seated. Count Basie makes you 'wanna' dance! The jazz program was held in the Grand Foyer at the Kennedy Center, the same area where the renowned JFK Bust is located. This eight foot, 300 pound bronze bust, designed and created by American sculptor Robert Berks, reminds us that the nation's performing arts center also stands as a living memorial to our 35th president, John Fitzgerald Kennedy. On either side of the bust is an interactive exhibit that provides visitors with a look into the life and times of JFK.



## Council of Governments (COG) Program Highlights

On Thursday, 19 August, 2004 Calvin Smith, Director of Human Services, Planning and Public Safety for the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) gave a presentation on Readiness and explained how coordination is playing a significant role in making the Washington DC metropolitan region better prepared. This was an excellent program that was attended by more than 70 Washington DC Post members and guests.



Calvin's responsibilities as Director at COG include the management oversight for over fifty public safety committees including police, fire and correctional chiefs, and their various subcommittees such as planning, technology, communication, Chaplain's, and Urban Search and Rescue. He also provides management for COG's Regional Emergency Coordination Plan (RECP) and the Regional Incident Communications and Coordination System.

The Council of Governments (COG) is an association of 19 local governments in the Washington area, and provides a focus for action and develops sound regional response to such issues as the environment, affordable housing, economic development, health and family concerns, population growth, public safety, and transportation. Founded in 1957, COG is supported by financial contributions from its participating local governments, federal and state grants, and private sector funding.

# COMMANDER NAVY INSTALLATIONS (CNI)

Commander Navy Installations (CNI) was officially created as an organization on 1 October 2003, reducing the number of claimants responsible for planning, programming, budgeting and executing resources from eight to one. Since 1997, the Navy has addressed improved shore installation effectiveness by regionalizing and reducing the number of installation management claimants, first from 18 to 8. The Navy initiative that has been a major driving focus has been the establishment of a single headquarters organization "to provide consistent, effective and efficient shore installation services and support to sustain and improve current and future fleet readiness and mission execution". Approximately \$9.7B of Navy's FY2003 Total Obligation Authority was allocated for Shore Infrastructure Management by CNI.

Rear Admiral Christopher Weaver, Commander, Navy Installations and Director, Ashore Readiness Division (OPNAV N46), will give a presentation and provide a CNI overview.
