

# Washington DC Post Programs

## ACEC/MW Annual Conference June 4, 2008

For the second year, our Post had the opportunity to partner with the American Council of Engineering Companies Metropolitan Washington Chapter on their annual conference, "Innovation Meeting Partnership". Continuing Education credits were awarded for sessions on Transportation, BIM, and Federal & Local Government projects. Post President CDR Nelson Mix opened the event by leading the pledge of allegiance with a moment of silence, and also gave some remarks during the lunch portion of the meeting. Special thanks to Mr. Philios Angelides, PE, Alpha Corporation, for moderating sessions and realizing the partnership.

## Consolidation of Bethesda Naval Hospital and Walter Reed July 31, 2008

CDR J.D. Mitchell provided an update on the current and future construction of the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC) at Bethesda, MD. As the Resident Officer in Charge of Construction for NAVFAC Washington, CDR Mitchell has been heavily involved in the expansion required at Bethesda to accommodate the movement of services from Walter Reed Army Medical Center to Bethesda.

The construction program at Bethesda is approximately \$1B over 3 years. It includes two million square feet of new construction and renovation. To complete the program on-time, CDR Mitchell anticipates a daily workforce of 1000+ persons from July 2009 to March 2010.

## Preserving Smithsonian Treasures: Building, Operating and Maintaining Its Facilities August 28, 2008

MG Clair F. Gill, USA (Ret), Deputy Director/Chief of Staff for the Office of Facilities and Operations, Smithsonian Institution discussed the challenges facing the Smithsonian Institution, including facilities that are aged, with obsolete systems, a track record of understated need, and a long history of underfunding. These are compounded by buildings that have high traffic, functional diversity and architectural variety. The Smithsonian Institution consists of over 710 facilities of 12 million square feet on 19,000 acres.
